



EU RoHS 3 Declaration

July 2019

Directive (EU) 2015/863 ("RoHS 3") amends Directive 2011/65/EU ("RoHS 2") to add four substances to the existing list of six, as set out below together with their prescribed limits.

The original six substances as defined by 2011/65/EU are:

- Lead (Pb) : 0.1%
- Mercury: 0.1%
- Cadmium (Cd): 0.01%
- Hexavalent chromium (Cr6+) : 0.1%
- Polybrominated Biphenyls (PBB): 0.1 %
- Polybrominated Diphenyl Ethers (PBDE): 0.1 %

The four substances added by (EU) 2015/863 are:

- Bis(2-Ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP): max 0.1%
- Benzyl butyl phthalate (BBP): max 0.1%
- Dibutyl phthalate (DBP): max 0.1%
- Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP): max 0.1%

These revised restrictions pass into effect on July 22, 2019 for electrical equipment other than categories 8 and 9, whose restrictions take effect from July 22, 2021.

All products supplied by Cobra Electronics Ltd. meet the requirements of Directive 2011/65/EU and Directive (EU) 2015/863 and do not contain any of these substances above the specified limits.

Cobra Electronics Ltd. may supply or produce non-compliant products in response to customer demand; such products will be clearly identified as non-compliant at the point of sale.
